

**Constitution of  
The Florence Area Radio Control Aircraft Association\*

AMA Charter # 4634  
(Adopted July 10 2005)**

**ARTICLE I - NAME**

The Name of this club shall be “the Florence Area Radio Controlled Aircraft Association”, herein referred to as the “FARCAA”.

**ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

**Section 1.** The objectives of this club shall be to promote all phases of radio controlled model aircraft building and flying and to support the national programs of the Academy of Model Aeronautics, hereafter known as the “AMA”.

**Section 2.** All special or local enterprises of the FARCAA shall conform to the policies of the AMA and to the regulations promulgated by that organization.

**Section 3.** The FARCAA will maintain the AMA charter and will pay all fees necessary for continuance of said charter.

**ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

**Section 1.** MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS All members of the FARCAA must hold and maintain a current individual Flyer’s license issued by the AMA. All members of the FARCAA must maintain and comply with current appropriate Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulations regarding the operation of their RC radio equipment.

**Section 2.** Dues Membership dues will be as prescribed in the club by-laws.

**Section 3.** Membership. Membership will be granted to any applicant who meets the qualification set forth in the by-laws, after first meeting the requirements for membership set forth in Article III, Section 1 of the Constitution.

**Section 4.** Voting Qualification and rules for voting on club business shall be as prescribed in the club by-laws.

## **ARTICLE IV-AUTHORITY**

No member may contract in the name of the FARCAA nor shall any obligation be entered into or solicited by any member unless that member has been previously authorized to do so by the board of directors; however duly elected or appointed officers of the club may conduct regular business in the name of the club under the guidelines provided in the Club By-laws.

## **ARTICLE V-AMENDMENTS**

**Section 1. Timing of Amendment proposals.** Proposed amendments may be made to this Constitution, by any voting-eligible member in writing at any properly called general meeting of the club membership

**Section 2. Proposing Amendments.** Proposed amendments shall be presented in writing to be considered at least one month prior to adoption, and if approved, a copy of the approved language shall be given to the secretary for incorporation into the club's official copy of the Constitution.

**Section 3. Adoption.** An amendment must be approved by a 2/3-majority vote of the eligible voting members. Members may vote either at a meeting properly called by the Board, they may authorize another voting-eligible member to vote for them by proxy or they may submit their vote in writing. Proxy authorization must be in writing. Written votes must reach the Board for inclusion by the end of the properly called regular meeting at which the amendment adoption is to be considered by the members.

## **ARTICLE VI – DISSOLUTION OF THE CLUB**

The Club may be dissolved with the approval of a 2/3-majority vote of the total voting-eligible membership. Administrative procedures and distribution of club assets shall be conducted in accordance with the by-laws.
